Instructions	*Students performing need to commit to <u>three days – Wednesday, April 30 to Friday, May 2nd</u> *Please remember to <u>bring all your own tools, supplies and musical instruments (if required)</u>
3:30 pm	Performers arrive for technical run through at Clarence Fulton Secondary
6:00 pm	Performances at Clarence Fulton Secondary
Thursday, May 1st	
12:00 – 4:30 pm	Students set up displays
4:30-6:00 pm	Dinner break (Open to Students at 6:00 pm) Students must be at their booth, ready to greet the public by 6:15PM.
6:30 – 8:30 pm	Open to the Public
Friday, May 2nd	
8:00 am	Students arrive
8:15 am	Mr. Friesen, Director for Student Learning will welcome the students.
8:30-9:20 am	Peer judging: A judges B - 15 minute interview + 5 minutes for filling out form B judges A - 15 minute interview + 5 minutes for filling out form
9:30 am	Expert judges to meet with their students to introduce themselves.
9:30 am	Judging will start – Expert and District judging. *Be aware, judges may not come right away, depending on number of students to judge.
10:00 – 2:00pm	Open to the public
11:30- 12:00 pm	Lunch provided by VSS for students. Inform a committee member if you have yet to be judged.
2:00 pm	When the judging is complete, the booths can be taken down. You are responsible for taking home everything you brought in, as well as taking down the wooden panels and stacking them for removal.
2:30 pm	Cleanup – Truck arrives to pick up panels and students will help load.

Booth Etiquette

Here are a few “hints” on how to look as professional as possible.

- Dress like it is a job interview – neat, clean, no Logo T-shirts, no ball caps, or too much “skin” (it’s not a beach).
- Judges will be wearing name lanyards. Smile and introduce yourself, shake hands, offer them a seat, make eye contact, be honest and polite. Remember this is a competition and you want to present yourself the best you can.
- Keep some water for yourself, snacks are ok but try not to look like you’re on a “break”.
- Although it’s always nice to have friends and family visit, remember the judges need to talk to you and they don’t have time to wait while you finish conversations with others. They are aware that the public will certainly be asking questions related to your project, but they don’t want to wait too long.

- Please put your phone on vibrate and don’t answer it or text when your judge is there.
- You are encouraged to have something to do with your hands – maybe show that you are working on something new, a new art or wood piece? Recipe? Etc. It shows how professional you are as well as helps control the nervous jitters.
