School Supplies

Students should come to class on opening day prepared to work, with pen/pencil, binder and notepaper.

Teachers will advise students of any special supplies that they will need for their courses. These supplies may include items such as glue sticks, calculators, scissors, felt pens, etc.

Lockers

This year, we will require that all students use a school lock. This will allow us to help manage our lockers better and to support our students. If a student needs a lock, we will provide them with a lock that will remain the school's property. The locks will be owned by the school and will need to be returned by students before leaving the school or they will be charged \$10. Students who have previously purchased and used a lock from the school can continue to use that lock. If one of our locks fails, we will replace it. If a student loses their lock, they will have to pay for a replacement.

Grad is a wonderful celebration that students look forward to every year. It is full of rich traditions that have grown over the years. There is also a trend of non-sanctioned social events in some Okanagan communities such as Vernon. This includes an all-night bush party. Bush parties involve drinking and drug use, vandalism, fighting, and even confrontations with the police. Pranks have caused thousands of dollars in damage to campsites and public areas. It is also known that these events involve young adults who are not attending school. There are no controls on who participates, or no safeguards to ensure safety. If an accident or incident happens, medical services are not easily available.

Most of our grade 12 students are responsible and mature young adults. However, they are kids and as kids, they are subject to peer pressure. As educators and parents, we need to help them make responsible and safe decisions. The aforementioned activity is unsafe and is not condoned by the school or the school district. There is no tolerance for the association of drugs and alcohol in schools. If students do attend school after a night

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of drinking, they will face consequences that jeopardize their education.

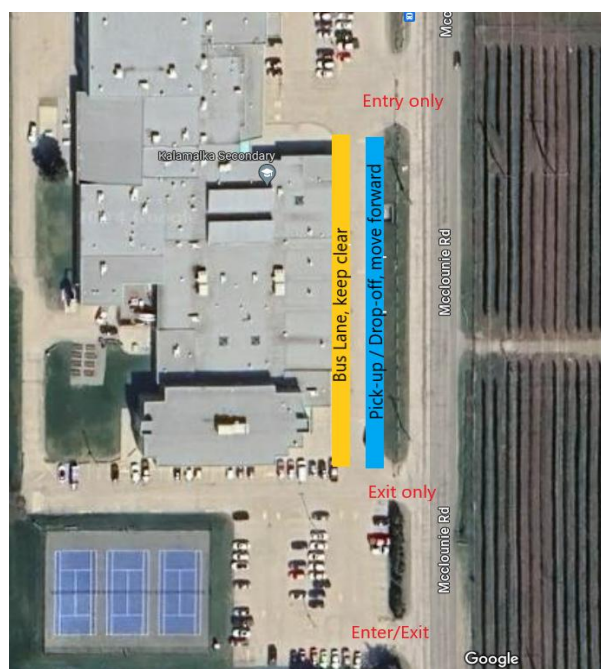
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Coming to school with shirts and skin covered in felt pen does not portray the right message to our younger students, therefore students will be sent home to change if this happens. These events can cast a shadow on all the grade 12 students and most importantly put our students in danger.

Pick-up/Drop-off in Parking Lot

A friendly reminder to keep our bus lane and entry-way clear when picking up and dropping off your child. Follow all signage and lines for entry and exit. We also ask parents to move forward in the pick-up / drop-off lane as far as possible during busy times so that more cars can pull in behind.

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CAREER PROGRAMS

There are many more program offerings in Kelowna. Apply early (a year ahead of the program start date) to give yourself the best chance of getting in. See Mr. Thorpe for more information and to apply.

SD22 will pay the full tuition for all successful applicants.

Work in Trades

Do you work with a certified tradesperson? You can earn 16 credits towards graduation while earning money and hours towards your trade as a Youth Apprentice. These courses can be completed while in high school or after graduation. Students that complete the program may be eligible for the \$1000 Youth Work in Trades Award.

Work Experience

Do you work or volunteer? Get high school credit through the Work Experience program. 120 hours of work = 4 credits. This course can be completed over the summer as well. Students must be registered and activated in Work Experience to start counting hours towards the 120 required.

Academic Dual Credit

Take a first-year course at Okanagan College in your gr. 12 year. Courses are offered after school/evenings twice a week. SD22 will pay the tuition for successful applicants.

Forestry and Trades Program 11/12

This program provides work ready skills and certificates for students interested in Forestry and/or trades. Students are introduced to welding, electrical, plumbing, carpentry, and heavy duty mechanics/automotive service technician.

Jean Minguy RCMP Youth Academy

This is a police academy simulation for students interested in law enforcement as a possible career. This weeklong camp is held at the DND in Vernon every May with volunteer RCMP officers.

Jr. Fire Crew Program

The BC Wildfire Service is looking for gr. 12s interested in fighting forest fires in the summer. A lunchtime information session will be held before spring break, followed by interviews and training for those shortlisted.

Okanagan College Trades Sampler

This 12-week program is designed to provide gr. 9-12 students with an opportunity to explore several different skilled trades. Students will gain first-hand knowledge and practical skills that will assist them in exploring a rewarding career in the trades.

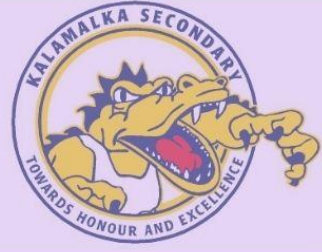

OUR COLLECTIVE RESPONSIBILITY

School Act, RSBC 1996, c 412.

Responsibilities of the School:

The school must Inform parents of the student's attendance, behaviour and progress in school. The school must also consult with the student and/or parent regarding the student's educational program.

Responsibilities of the Student and Parent(s)

A student must enrol and participate in an educational program as provided by a board or by the principal of a Provincial school. A student must also comply with the school rules and district codes of conduct.

School attendance plays a vital role in your child's academic success and overall well-being. Regular attendance helps students grow intellectually, emotionally, socially, and physically—preparing them to meet the challenges of adulthood with confidence and capability.

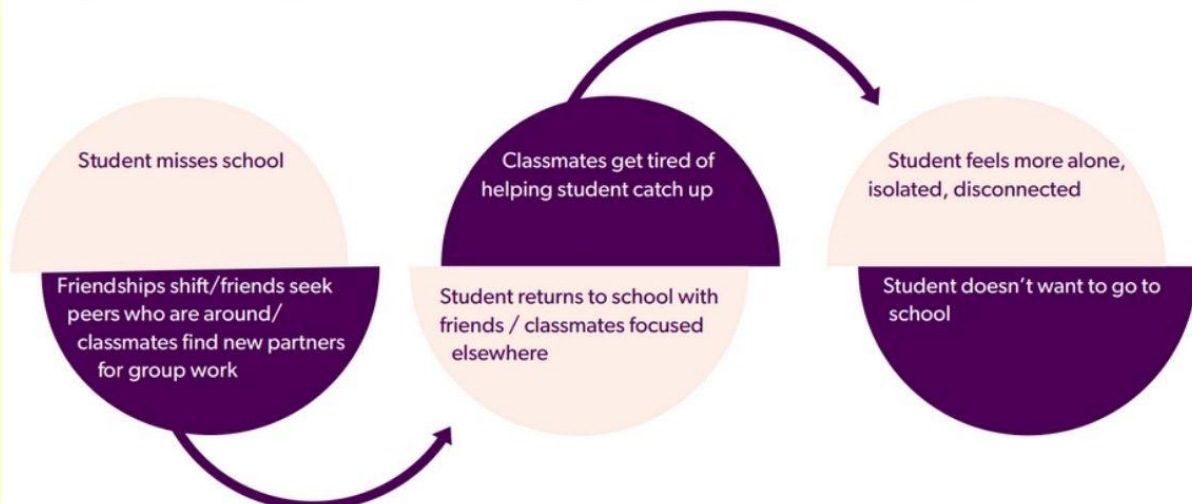
As parents, one of our key responsibilities is to ensure that your child attends school every day, ready to learn. While we understand that occasional absences may be unavoidable, it is important to minimize missed instructional time to support your child's continuous learning and development.

Our school is committed to partnering with you to help your child succeed. Together, we can create a strong foundation for lifelong learning and personal growth.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

The impact of absenteeism on student academic success is well understood by families, students and their teachers. For many students the impact on self-esteem, academic confidence, anxiety and peer connection can be even greater. Students who miss school fall behind in classwork, which can make them feel frustrated, embarrassed and disengaged. This causes them to miss even more school, reinforcing the cycle. It is important that we work together to prevent this cycle and intervene quickly if it begins to develop.

PARENTS SUPPORTING ATTENDANCE HABITS

You can help your child develop lifelong attendance habits by:

- Establishing consistent bedtimes and morning routines
- Encouraging responsibility for missed school work
- Keeping open, on-going communication with teachers
- Addressing school-related stress before it escalates
- Sharing and/or seeking out best practices from other parents/families/guardians
- Seeking support from school staff or community programs.

Questions you can ask your child:

- How do they feel about school?
- Are certain subjects or environments causing stress?
- Are they facing social challenges, like making friends or feeling left out?
- Are they feeling overwhelmed academically?
- How is their mental and emotional well-being?
- Are there family or home-related factors affecting attendance?
- Do they feel supported by their teachers and school staff?

WHAT WE ARE DOING

- Informing parents of absences through our call-out system
- Supportive conversations with students
- Teachers, counsellors, support staff and administration contacting parents
- Supporting students with physical and mental health challenges
- Supporting students whose medical accommodations include extended absences
- Communicating clear expectations around attendance

SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

- Students are expected to attend school every day and arrive on time, ready to learn.
- For explained absences - Parent/Legal guardian must contact the office with a phone call or email kaloffice@sd22.bc.ca. Note that explained absences do not excuse the student from meeting the learning outcomes for that day.
- Students are expected to contact their teacher to keep up with the learning:
 - prior to a planned absence or/
 - immediately upon return from an unplanned absence
- Teachers provide students with opportunities to demonstrate their learning throughout the year. A significant proportion of the learning takes place in the classroom, and meeting some of the learning standards requires class participation. Extended absences may result in a student being unable to complete the course.
